While we're looking forward to some time to refresh and renew, the Foundation continues to move ahead in our quest to raise funds for the expansion of the oncology infusion program in the Collins Pavilion and, an exciting new initiative, the Oncology Patient Assistance Fund.

Financial and other issues often create barriers to cancer care that can have devastating consequences for patients, families, and communities. While government and nonprofit agencies aim to help, resources available to those in need are limited and narrowly defined, leading to lower rates of treatment compliance, completion, and recovery among underserved oncology patients.

Chilton Medical Center's Oncology Patient Assistance Fund will support patients experiencing financial hardships that represent either direct or indirect barriers to care. This resource was created to meet the physical and emotional needs that enable patients to successfully complete their cancer treatments.

Funds will be given based on financial need and will be used for clinical purposes such as medication, physical therapy, at-home medical supplies, and specialized prosthetics; or for basic needs related to treatment such as transportation, nutrition, childcare, utilities, and clothing. The goal is to fill gaps that would impede the patient's care and recovery if left open.

We're proud of the positive difference Chilton Medical Center and the Foundation are making in the lives of our oncology patients and their families — and we hope that you — our donors — take great pride in this as well!

I look forward to sharing progress on the oncology expansion in the Collins Pavilion in our next newsletter. Until then, we hope you enjoy this issue of "Community Connections" and catching up on all that has been happening within the Foundation.

ALL WERE WIDE-EYED AT SLEEP TALK

On June 11, nearly 90 residents of the Cedar Crest retirement community in Pompton Plains gathered for a program entitled, "Dreaming of a Good Night's Sleep? Here's Help!"

The program presenter, Federico Cerrone, MD, is board-certified in pulmonary, critical care, and sleep medicine by the American Board of Internal Medicine, with special interests in sleep disorders and pulmonary disease. He serves as medical director of the Lung Cancer Screening Program at Atlantic Health System and in administrative roles at Overlook Medical Center, as co-chair of the Atlantic Health System Pulmonary Integrated Care Committee and medical director of Sleep and Breathing Disorders.

Dr. Cerrone discussed strategies for improving sleep, how a lack of sleep impacts overall health, and new innovations that can help those struggling with issues related to sleep.

The program was a joint collaboration between the Chilton Medical Center Foundation and Community Health.

Positive projected outcomes for patients of the Collins Pavilion Infusion Center include:

- Access to a complete array of oncology outpatient services including radiation and immunotherapy, just a short distance from home
- Availability of the continuum of care, offered through Atlantic Health, to efficiently meet any/all of patients' health care needs
- Familiar surroundings and dedicated staff who live and work locally create a sense of community and comfort for patients and less disruption in their daily lives during treatment
- Enhanced privacy in treatment areas

Led by Lydia Nadeau, RN, MBA, Executive Director, Oncology Service Line, Atlantic Health, and Sandra Leo, RN, Nurse Manager, the Collins Pavilion Infusion Center staff is a dedicated team of health care professionals. Additional aspects of the project include:

- Updating the Atlantic Medical Group (AMG) Medical Oncology Suite
- · Enlarging the on-site pharmacy
- Creating new conference space and offices
- Establishing a satellite of the Glasser Brain Tumor Center

CHILTON MEDICAL CENTER BENEFITS FROM WOMEN'S VISION FOR HEALTH CARE COUNCIL

The Women's Vision for Health Care Council is a group of volunteers who offer their support for initiatives and programs to benefit patients served by Chilton Medical Center. Members pledge a twoyear gift commitment of \$1,000 per year, which they individually designate for the project that is most meaningful. Recently funded projects have included support for Chilton's Nursing Scholars' program and for the expansion of the infusion center in the Collins Pavilion.

The centerpiece of the group's March meeting was a presentation by Sandy Leo, Nurse Manager for the Infusion Center, who demonstrated the use of Paxman cold cap technology, an innovation that helps prevent hair loss in chemotherapy patients. Since patients who are underinsured or uninsured may not have the means to access the benefits of Paxman



technology, the Foundation seeks to establish a fund to cover the cost of an individual kit so that all patients who want to take advantage of this intervention can do so. OUR GENEROUS COMMUNITY


